Dear Friends,

First and foremost congratulations to Sue Johnson who has been voted in as our new Diocesan President for the next triennial; she will take over from me in 2019. I am so pleased that she be leading us for the next three years.

By the time you receive this magazine we will also have had the voting for the Trustee Board to work with Sue in faith and I am confident that members will answer God's call and come forward to serve. If not, why not!!



BUT I have not stood down as yet and it is business as usual for me until the end of the year and as well as elections your Trustee Board is working on and bringing ourselves in line with the new legislation that comes into force at the end of May -General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). I am sure by now this is not unfamiliar to you as all organisations that hold personal data is having to fall in line with the new regs. We will be in touch with Branch Leaders with more detail but the "rule of thumb" for everyone is if you hold personal data on behalf of MU you must ask yourselves the question do I need it, is it relevant to my position in MU, if the answer is yes then it needs to be either password protected on the computer or in a locked cabinet. If it is not needed then it needs to be shredded or in my case my husband Den has the occasional bonfire at the end of the garden.

As well as all the admin and legislation we are embracing this year's theme "In Mary Sumner's Footsteps". It is wonderful to relate to her story and realise what an impact she made all those years ago and isn't it great that through the years since that day in 1876 Mothers' Union has continued to be there for families building on her legacy in so many different ways throughout the world and having a presence in 84 countries with members in Peru being the latest.

This year's theme is part of a new Initiative that is being rolled out throughout the world called MULOA – **Mothers' Union Listens, Observes and Acts**. At Worldwide Council in February Sue Johnson and I joined others in Swanwick at the launch of MULOA in Britain and Ireland. It was a very full on 4 days and what at first seemed confusing and too much to take on board all was revealed by the time we came home and Sue and I drove down the M1 getting very enthusiastic about the whole process and how in the end it offers a clear approach to how we can put our faith into action. This new approach complements existing projects and challenges members to look further at what they might be able to do in the future in their church or community. We explored in "family" groups; made up with members from different parts of the UK, what it is to belong to Mothers' Union and how we can contribute to making a real difference to people's lives.

I have just returned from a Canterbury Provincial Conference in Hoddesdon (see photo above) and part of our time together was taken up with sharing our different experiences around our Diocese with MULOA. Sue and I have taken "bite size" exercises of MULOA to Trustees and Area Meetings in Kensington and Edmonton in the London Diocese and reached approx. 100 members and are pleased to say we have had a very good response. We had a pleasant afternoon at St.Mary's Osterley Kensington and following updates of what is happening in the London Diocese we had a taster of the MULOA initiative. As you can see in the photo time was spent in groups discussing new ideas and projects like how to support young families in their homes and church and the challenges that would have to be faced.

In the Edmonton Area we met at St.Aldhelms and again following an update on MU we listened to the Mary Sumner Story and members wrote on their



own "Mary Sumner's footprint" why they joined MU and what it means to them. It was good to read the positive outlook of members and as the words on one footstep said "Helping others and not thinking of your own wants". Group discussion followed on new initiatives and how to move forward in London identifying challenges and how to address them using stepping stones over a river as a visual tool



At both meetings all the challenges, ideas, initiatives were offered to our Lord and the MULOA Prayer was said by all. Sue and I are looking forward to visiting Willesden and Stepney Areas with MULOA .

As I said at the beginning of this letter we welcome Sue Johnson as our new Diocesan President for the next triennium and I do hope you will support her as she is commissioned at our AGM in Diocesan House on Monday 26th November by Bishop Sarah, our new Bishop of London. Good idea to put this in

your diary now!

Let us go forward following "in Mary Sumner's Footsteps" and always remember that prayer is at the heart of everything we do in the MU. May we continue to listen to our Lord Jesus and be ready to answer his Call.

The new Mothers' Union Worldwide Constitution has been approved. The Privy Council

Office confirmed that at a meeting of the Privy Council held on the afternoon of 24th April 2018 at Windsor Castle, Her Majesty The Queen was pleased to approve the Order amending the Charter of Mothers' Union. The amendments to the Bye-laws were also approved by the Privy Council. The Regulations were approved at Worldwide Council. The new Constitution is now being posted on the website.
